#### Thesis & Dissertation Deadlines: Spring 2026 – Regular Semester



To have your degree awarded at the end of the spring semester, you may complete all requirements either during intersession (the time between terms, before the spring semester begins) or during the regular spring semester.

This sheet lists all required items for the Regular Semester Deadlines. All posted deadlines are firm and must be met for your degree to be awarded in Spring 2026. If you cannot meet these deadlines, review the Thesis & Dissertation Deadlines for Fall 2026 and notify your graduate specialist of your updated completion plans.

Task	Description	Regular Semester Deadline
Apply for Graduation	Submit your application so your name appears on the graduation list and your degree can be awarded. This must be done even if you do not plan to participate in a commencement ceremony.	March 17
Attend Formatting Workshop	Attend the formatting workshop and/or help sessions offered by Graduate Education. The workshop provides guidance on using the thesis/dissertation Word template.	February 25
Submit Early Draft	Submit a complete draft (title page through vita, with all sections/references/appendices) for the first format check. You may continue revising content afterward, but this check helps catch formatting issues early.	March 8
Submit <u>Final</u> Doctoral Defense Notification Form	Doctoral students must submit the details of their defense so it can be publicized at least 7 days in advance. It this requirement is not met, the defense must be rescheduled.	10 days before defense
Submit Pre-Defense Draft	Once your final defense is scheduled, submit an updated draft to your assigned format checker for review.	April 5
Final Defense	Present your research to your committee at your scheduled defense. Enrollment on the date of the exam is required*.	April 17
Form 7 Due	Form 2/7 must reach Graduate Education (gradforms@mst.edu) by the deadline, with all departmental approvals complete. You are responsible for ensuring the form reaches Graduate Education on time. Final approval will not be given until your thesis/dissertation has been accepted.	April 22
Submit Post- Defense Draft	After making committee revisions and submitting Form 2/7, send your updated draft to your assigned format checker for a third review. Be sure all formatting corrections have been made, as unresolved issues can delay graduation.	April 22
Submit Final Draft	Submit your corrected, fully formatted thesis/dissertation by the posted deadline, following the instructions provided by your format checker. <u>Missing</u> this deadline means your degree cannot be awarded this term.	April 29

\*If exam occurs during the intersession, the student must have been enrolled in the immediately preceding semester/session; or, prior to the exam, they must enroll in one credit hour of Oral Exam, 5040/6040.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Commencement Ceremony — This is the celebration event where you may choose to walk. You are not required to attend. You may only walk in the ceremonies listed for your degree award term.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Intersession—If you finish during intersession, your degree is still awarded in that same semester (e.g., Before start of fall semester = December: Before start of spring semester = May: Before start of summer session = July)

## **Forms Workflow Information**

- Workflows are set up/managed manually for each form.
- Updates such as new department chairs, staff, or coordinators are not made automatically and require an email notification to Jade.
- If you are going to be out of the office, please be proactive regarding approval of the forms.
  - For short-term absences, we can update the approval emails in a workflow on a case-by-case basis.
  - For longer-term absences, the workflow itself will need to be updated to reflect the appropriate approver.



## **Reminders and Deadlines**

#### Reminders

- When a graduate student takes the master's comprehensive exam, doctoral qualifying exam, doctoral comprehensive exam, or defends their thesis/dissertation, they must be enrolled on the date of the exam/defense occurs during the intersession, the student must have been enrolled in the immediate preceding semester/session; or, prior to the exam/defense date, they must enroll in one credit hour of Oral Examination, 5040/6040 (charged as an examination-only fee)
- Doctoral students are required to submit the details of their defense so that it can be publicized by Graduate Education at least one week prior to the defense. Students are requested to submit the Final Doctoral Defense Notification Form 10 days before the defense.
- After a student submits a form in the workflow, they receive a confirmation email with a link that allows them to track their request. It is their responsibility to make sure the form makes it through the required approvals.
- To maintain continuous enrollment as required by Policy Memo II-20, doctoral students can enroll in research OR for students that have left campus, continuous registration (6050). Continuous registration is not considered full-time enrollment and therefore not appropriate enrollment for students on a GRA/GTA/GA appointment.

- Fall 2025 Final Semester Deadlines
  - Form 1A/5A,; Substitution for Required Certificate Form; Certificate Program Courses Form
    - Last day of the semester
  - Thesis/Dissertation pre-defense draft due
    - November 2
  - Form 2/7: Results of final defense and approval of the thesis/dissertation
    - November 14
  - Final thesis/dissertation must be accepted by Graduate Education
    - November 21
  - Form 1B: Appointment of Committee for Comprehensive Exam (Biological Sciences program only)
    - 10 days before the exam
  - Form 3: Results of Non-Thesis Master of Science Comprehensive Examination (Biological Sciences program only)
    - Last day of the semester
